

Mr. Kiran Kumar Reddy

Mr. Nallari Kiran Kumar Reddy was elected as the 16th Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh in November, 2010. He is a four-time Member of Legislative Assembly. He was the Government Chief Whip for five years (2004-09) and then Speaker of the Assembly for one and half years (May, 2009 to November, 2010).

Mr. Reddy handled both the jobs of Chief Whip and Speaker to the best of his ability and to the satisfaction of all sections. Mr. Kiran Kumar Reddy was first elected to Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly from Vayalpadu constituency of Chittoor district in the year 1989.

Mr. Kiran Kumar Reddy was born on 13th September, 1960 in Hyderabad. Mr. Reddy is a Commerce graduate from Nizam College. He also did LLB from Osmania University.

His father, Late Mr. Nallari Amarnath Reddy was a strong and respected politician from Chittoor and also a close aide of former Prime Ministers, Smt. Indira Gandhi and Mr. P. V. Narasimha Rao. Mr. Nallari Amarnath Reddy was a minister in Congress cabinet from 1978 to 1982.

Nallari Kiran Kumar Reddy was a promising cricketer during his student days and represented the State and even South Zone of the Country in national and international tournaments.
